subtle oak integration. Opens firmly as a big, dry and dusty Cabernet ahead of an infusion of raspberry-inspired fruit. The full bodied palate with long, savoury tannins give this

rich, flavoursome wine good persistence.

Food Pairing Good texture and herbaceousness means

this wine pairs well with savoury dishes such as rosemary roast lamb, aromatic pasta and smoked cheeses. Game meats with gentle sauces will also combine well with this wine.
